

Still et yet

TOUS DEUX SIGNIFIENT **ENCORE** MAIS ILS SONT PARFOIS OPPOSÉS... FAISONS LE POINT

● En anglais "still" et "yet" sont deux façons de

- signifier qu'une situation n'a pas changé :

It's still snowing/It hasn't stopped snowing yet;

- faire un bilan par rapport au moment où l'on parle :

He still hasn't arrived/He hasn't arrived yet.

● "Still" indique que quelque chose reste inchangé :

I had a sandwich but I'm still hungry.

"Are you still living in Alaska?"

- "No, I've moved to Canada."

"Are you working now?"

- "No, I'm still a student."

My parents are still angry about the

mess we made at the party.

● "Yet" s'utilise lorsqu'il s'agit de faire un bilan, principalement dans des phrases négatives et dans des questions.

"Yet" se trouve généralement à la fin de la phrase. Notez que ce mot est souvent accompagné du *present perfect*.

Il y a au moins trois façons de traduire "yet" en français.

- Par "encore" :

I'm starving. I haven't eaten yet.

Je n'ai pas encore mangé.

- Par "toujours" :

It's 3am and Lisa isn't home yet.

Lisa n'est toujours pas rentrée.

- Par "déjà" :

Have you made an appointment yet?

As-tu déjà pris un rendez-vous ?

- Il arrive aussi qu'on ne le traduise pas du tout :

"Have you found a job yet?"

- "No, I'm still unemployed." (ici, "yet" ne se traduit pas vraiment ou bien par "alors" : Alors est-ce que tu as trouvé un travail ?)

"Have you moved yet?"

- "Yes, I'm living in Canada now." (comme pour le premier exemple, on peut ne pas traduire "yet" du tout, ou bien utiliser "alors" : Alors tu as déménagé ?)

● Pour terminer, il est intéressant de noter que "still" et "yet" sont des opposés en quelque sorte :

We haven't left yet. = We're still here.

John hasn't finished his drink yet.

= He's still drinking.
