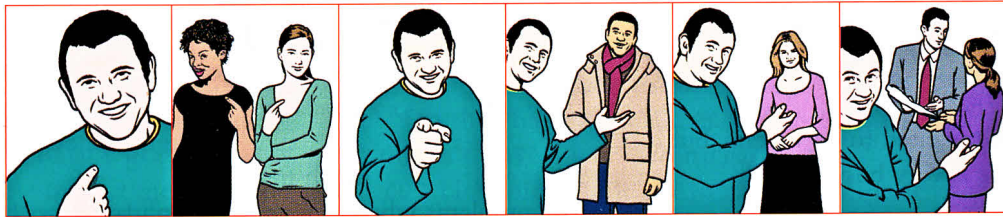


## I/me he/him they/them etc.

Tom knows me.

Je connais Tom. / Tom me connaît.  
Nous connaissons Tom. / Tom nous connaît.  
Tu connais Tom. / Tom te connaît.  
Il connaît Tom. / Tom le connaît.  
Elle connaît Tom. / Tom la connaît.  
Ils connaissent Tom. / Tom les connaît.

Lorsqu'il est sujet du verbe, **you** correspond à 'tu', 'vous' (singulier), ou 'vous' (pluriel).

Le pronom personnel objet se place après le verbe (Tom knows **him**), à la différence du français (Tom le connaît).

- ☐ I don't want **this book**. You can have **it**. ... Tu peux le prendre.
- ☐ I don't want **these books**. You can have **them**. ... Tu peux les prendre.
- ☐ Diane never drinks **milk**. She doesn't like **it**. ... Elle ne l'aime pas.
- ☐ I never go to **parties**. I don't like **them**. ... Je ne les aime pas.

En anglais, les objets et les animaux se distinguent grammaticalement des personnes:

- ☐ I don't like **this picture**. I don't like **it**. ... Je ne l'aime pas.
- ☐ I don't like **Paul**. I don't like **him**. ... Je ne l'aime pas.

C

Après les prépositions (**for/to/with** etc.), on emploie le pronom personnel objet (**me/her/them** etc.):

- ☐ This letter isn't **for me**. It's **for you**. ... pas pour moi. Elle est pour toi.
- ☐ Who is that woman? Why are you looking **at her**? ... Pourquoi la regardes-tu?
- ☐ We're going to the cinema. Do you want to come **with us**? ... Voulez-vous venir avec nous?
- ☐ Sue and Kevin are going to the cinema. Do you want to go **with them**? ... Veux-tu aller avec eux?
- ☐ 'Where's the newspaper?' 'You're sitting **on it**.' ... Tu es assis dessus.'

En général, **it/them** précèdent les autres compléments:

- ☐ I want that book. Please give **it to me**. ... Donne-le moi, s'il te plaît.
- ☐ Robert wants these books. Can you give **them to him**, please?  
... Pouvez-vous les lui donner, ... ?
